#### Expectations:


- How to do interoperability

- Need to define use cases for the repository

#### Conclusion:

- M/w and application developers are interested in using this type of infrastructure
- Useful infrastructure to support National Initiative
- Need to include rich metadata, which goes beyond component name and author (e.g. constraints, environment assertions, configuration scripts, origin/pedigree, development process, audit trail back to source)
- This could be used by developers to advertise their work, but also structure their contribution, according to an OMII-like ranking/marking (e.g. platform supported, standards compliance, ease of installation and configuration)
- The automated nature of the infrastructure imposes that s/w can be built, deployed, configured and tested automatically. This will help quality.
- We need to encourage and include contributions from a wide source and origin
- Need to allow and support users to run compliance tests, w.r.t. their own applications
- Need to provide site compliance tests
- Need to provide tests in the repository
- Need to further standards, in order to develop more benchmarks
- Need a regulator for competing s/w, but we're not there yet
- Need to understand how to sustain this type of work
