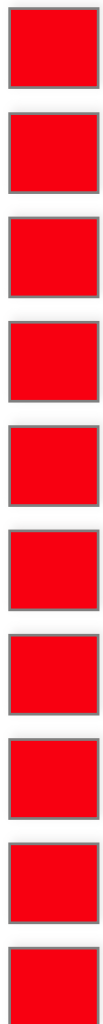


Word from the German e-IRG Delegate
