e-Infrastructure Forum: A must

- Synchronised service delivery: complementarity, bundles, KPIs / metrics, business models, helpdesk, etc.
- Joint training for Open Science areas to cover the whole research life-cycle
- Coherent message and common approach both for institutions (RPOs, RFOs, initiatives) and researchers. For both services & training serving <u>all</u> <u>science</u> & <u>all actors</u>
- Common development of the next e-Infrastructure generation: shared roadmap, scouting opportunities for innovation
- Collaboration via existing national nodes to build national infrastructure on open science, including skills. Fully embedded in Europe's
- Joint sustainability efforts
