Highlights:

- Integration: global approach, alignment of national agendas
- e-Infrastructure driven by (global) user communities, ESFRI, barriers of entry
- New arrival of data and metadata
- Surprising details, possible weak signals or future topics
 - Innovation as context for research, extending e-Infra user base
 - "Single" (on operations level)
 - sign on, representative for e-Infra service providers, legal entities in Europe,...
 - Going towards the background?
 - VO: option rather than requirement? New user communities, new structures
 - Legal issues? Now encapsulated to specific topics
 - "Ecosystem", usability, standards and industry mentioned quite infrequently
 - Exception: HPC service starting a new industry (instead of just serve and engage)

Often mentioned next steps

- Engaging with the users in new ways: the policy level (governance, funding), joint analysis of requirements
- Plan on how to deal with broadening technology palettes (Cloud, multi-middleware, dark fiber) and simplify user experience and be sustainable!
 - · Are these three issues tackled together within and across organisations?
